Payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation. The ITT office accepts U.S. dollars, VISA, MasterCard, American Express and U.S. checks. Japanese yen is not accepted. Certain trips offer payment plans and will be indicated on the tour description.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on tours. Yokota ITT is not responsible for the loss or damage of personal belongings during tours.

Tour itineraries may change due to traffic and/or other uncontrollable circumstances. The itinerary may also change prior to departure. In the case of itinerary changes, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.
















Built on a 650m island surrounded by 360° of water, the "Umihotaru Parking Area" is located about midway on the Tokyo Bay Agua Line Expressway. It is a bridge/tunnel combination with an overall length of 14 km, which includes a $4.4 \, \mathrm{km}$ bridge and a $9.6 \, \mathrm{km}$ tunnel. It is the fourth longest underwater tunnel in the world. Mt Nokogiri and its mountain range is shaped like the teeth of a saw. A Buddhist temple, Nihon-ji, is located near the summit and it dates back to 725. The highlight of Mount Nokogiri is the Jigoku Nozoki, or "peak in hell", is a thrilling view point located at the mountain top. There are 400+ steps to get to the top, so it's not a walk in the park. On this mountain, there are over 2,600 steps altogether. After "peaking in hell" let's take a look at the Buddha statue carved out of stone located midway on the mountain. At 102 ft (31 m) it is as tall as a ten-story building. On our way back, we will take the 40-minute ferryboat across Tokyo Bay.

Fukiware Waterfall is located in Northern Gunma prefecture and is considered one of the 100 best waterfalls in Japan. It is almost 100 ft. wide and has a U-shape with water falling from three different directions. The locals call it the "Niagara Falls of Asia", though the size is much smaller. Take a leisurely walk along the river and marvel at the breathtaking views of the Fukiware Waterfall and its natural surroundings. Takasaki Byakue Kannon or White-Robed Kannon is a large statue of the goddess of mercy, Kannon. She stands on Jigan-in Temple grounds in Takasaki, Gunma prefecture. At 137 ft tall, it has nine levels with 146 steps. The levels are lined with 20 statues of Buddhist deities. It takes about 15 minutes to reach the 9th level, which is about shoulder high, providing a great view over the city and surrounding mountains.

It's also interesting to see how the mother watches over their baby when it wonders off of their bodies. After the monkey park, we will stop by Shinshu Fruits Land for some cherry picking with all-you-can-eat cherries for 30 minutes.

Ushiku Daibutsu was the tallest Buddhist statue until 2008 when it was surpassed by the Spring Temple Buddha in China. The Ushiku Buddha stands at 394 ft, equivalent to a 38-story building. 
