

**YOKOTA ITT TOUR POLICY**

Yokota ITT tours are open to all SOFA status members, including active duty military, U.S. DoD civilians, retired military and their dependents. Sponsored guests of eligible customers may participate on ITT tours. Customers must be 18 or older to sign up for ITT tours. Participants 17 and under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Local National Employees and JASDF members may sign up for tours starting 7 days prior to the tour date on non-SOFA eligible tours.

Eligible customers are permitted to purchase up to ten tickets. For special tours, customers are permitted to purchase up to five tickets.

Please sign up for tours in person at the ITT office. Reservations over the phone or on Yokota ITT's Facebook are not accepted.

Please notify ITT staff of any special needs you or your family may have (e.g., wheelchair accessibility, physical or health disabilities, etc.)

Payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation. The ITT office accepts U.S. dollars, VISA, MasterCard, American Express and U.S. checks. Japanese yen is not accepted. Certain trips offer payment plans and will be indicated on the tour description.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on tours. Yokota ITT is not responsible for the loss or damage of personal belongings during tours.

Tour itineraries may change due to traffic and/or other uncontrollable circumstances. The itinerary may also change prior to departure. In the case of itinerary changes, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Trips may be canceled due to unforeseen circumstances. If canceled, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for customers that cannot be contacted by their phone number or email provided at time of booking. Please read the brochure's tour descriptions thoroughly. There will be rest stops on all tours lasting over two hours. It is recommended that you bring enough yen to cover the cost of snacks and meals. Please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to departure time to allow yourself enough time to check in and find a seat. The bus will depart promptly on schedule.

Buses for all ITT tours depart from the parking lot between the Enlisted Club and building 2000. We ask that all passengers return to the same seat taken at the beginning of the tour and return to the bus on time as directed by the tour guide.

Parents must ensure their children are well behaved and do not disturb other passengers. Listening and/or watching videos, music, etc. is permitted with the use of headphones. Please refrain from talking on the phone while seated on the bus.

Yokota ITT will make every reasonable effort to accommodate group seating when requested. However, due to seating and ticket availability, this may not always be possible.

**YOKOTA TOUR WAIT-LIST POLICY**

A waiting list is available for tours that have reached maximum capacity. If there are any cancellations, ITT staff will contact those on the waiting list at most three times via phone. If there is no answer, ITT will move on to the next person on the list. Customers are responsible for making sure that the contact information provided is correct.

**INCLEMENT WEATHER**

All tour cancellations due to inclement weather will be determined by 4 p.m. the day before the scheduled tour. Customers will be notified by 6 p.m. the day before.

For multi-day trips where inclement weather causes and overnight delay, customers will be responsible to pay the associated additional cost.

**YOKOTA TOURS REFUND POLICY**

• **One-Day Tours**  
Refunds are provided for cancellations made four or more business days prior to the tour date. Cancellations made after four business days will not be refunded.

• **Overnight Tours**  
Please see the tour brochure for the cancellation policy.

In case of a TDY, TAD, exercise or recall, a written document (e.g., TDY orders or letter from squadron commander/first sergeant) must be presented prior to departure for a full refund. In the event that Yokota ITT has already purchased admission tickets, customers will have to pay for the ticket cost regardless of the reason for cancellation. Please have receipt ready at the time of refund. Refunds cannot be given 30 days after the event date.

**ALCOHOL POLICY**

Smoking and alcoholic beverages are not allowed on ITT Tour buses.

Open containers of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in the seating and aisle area of the bus. All coolers containing alcoholic beverages must be stored within the bus luggage compartment located below and separate from the seating compartment.

Passengers found in the seating area with an alcoholic beverage will be directed to immediately remove the beverage from the bus. Passengers who refuse to comply will be released at the closest train station or an equivalent location.

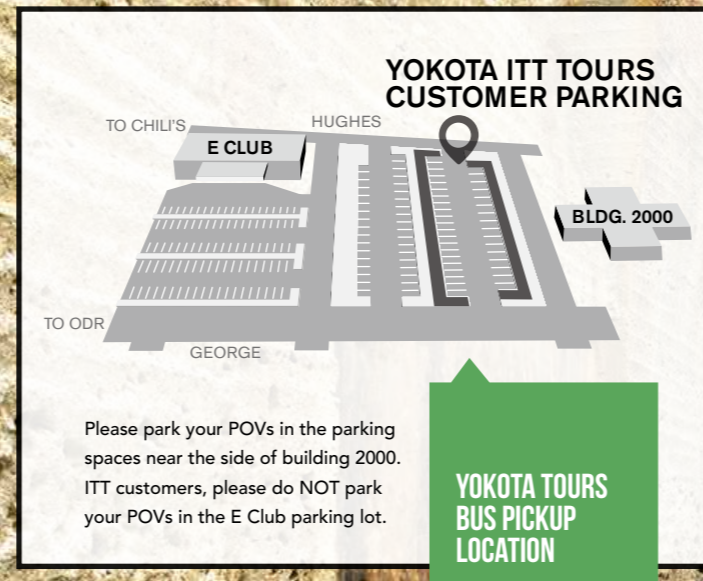

The Mishima Skywalk is the longest pedestrian suspension bridge in Japan where you can enjoy unrestricted panoramic views of the western slopes of Mt. Fuji as well as that of the Izu Mountains. The bridge is 1,312 ft long. Odawara Castle was originally built in the mid-15th century and soon fell into the hands of the Hojo Clan, one of the most powerful clans during the Warring States Era. In 1590 Toyotomi Hideyoshi attacked the castle, and with the defeat of the Hojo Clan, reunited Japan. The interior features exhibit on the history of the castle as well as displays of items such as armors and swords.

Would you like to meet a samurai? Have you ever seen a ninja in action? Do you know who Oiran was? Centuries ago, Samurai, Ninja and Oiran all lived in Edo, the place where Tokyo stands today. As any resident of Japan will tell you, the atmosphere of old Edo has long since evaporated from most of Tokyo, but don't despair, this former capital of the Tokugawa Shoguns continues to thrive in Nikko Edo Village. Nikko Edo Village is the theme park that reproduces the customs, cultures and society of Japan's Edo Period (1603-1867). This is not a museum. Nikko Edo Village is an attempt to produce a faithful re-creation of everyday life in old Edo. Visitors are transformed from mere onlookers into active participants in the daily activities of Edo townsfolk.

Kamakura is famous for the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan and a number of other iconic temples, shrines, and many old artistic treasures. It shows the high degree of prosperity that was present during the 12th and 13th centuries when Kamakura was the seat of the Shogunate Government. On this tour we'll take you to the beautiful Hase Temple, Kotokuin Temple with the Buddha statue and Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine.

Nestled in the forests of Tochigi Prefecture, this magnificent landmark memorializes Tokugawa Ieyasu, the founder of the Tokugawa Shogunate who ruled Japan for over 250 years. It's unlike any other shrine in Japan. Lavishly decorated with gold leaf and elaborate wood carvings, the Nikko Toshogu Shrine boasts over a dozen buildings. While exploring the grounds, you'll notice a few of the quirky carvings—a sleeping cat, clawed elephants, and the famous three monkeys posed in such a way to express the proverbial principle: see no evil, hear no evil, speak no evil. After, the tour will continue to the Oya Quarry. During the Edo Period, man-made caverns were used to harvest the much sought-after Oya, a soft, yet durable volcanic stone. Today, you can learn more at the museum and explore the vast network of underground hallways roughly 12 miles long.



## KUMAGAYA NIGHT FESTIVAL – UCHIWA MATSURI –

Kumagaya City is located in northern Saitama Prefecture, and had been flourished as a post station on Nakasendo Road during the Edo period. The Uchiwa Matsuri or fan festival is held in Kumagaya City and considered as No. 1 in the Kanto region. It is held for three days from July 20th to 22nd, and twelve Japanese festival floats will parade in the city area while playing ohayashi or Japanese festival music. It is one of the biggest events in Kumagaya City. Events are held at various places on the pedestrian-opened streets particularly at Community Square, visitors can experience ohayashi, a style of Japanese drumming. At dusk the festival floats stand ready to begin moving forward. They parade along the street while performing ohayashi music to each other at various locations.
