

YOKOTA ITT TOUR POLICY

Yokota ITT tours are open to all SOFA status members, including active duty military, U.S. DoD civilians, retired military and their dependents. Sponsored guests of eligible customers may participate on ITT tours. Customers must be 18 or older to sign up for ITT tours. Participants 17 and under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Local National Employees and JASDF members may sign up for tours starting 7 days prior to the tour date on non-SOFA eligible tours.

Eligible customers are permitted to purchase up to ten tickets. For special tours, customers are permitted to purchase up to five tickets.

Please sign up for tours in person at the ITT office. Reservations over the phone or on Yokota ITT's Facebook are not accepted.

Please notify ITT staff of any special needs you or your family may have (e.g., wheelchair accessibility, physical or health disabilities, etc.)

Payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation. The ITT office accepts U.S. dollars, VISA, MasterCard, American Express and U.S. checks. Japanese yen is not accepted. Certain trips offer payment plans and will be indicated on the tour description.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on tours. Yokota ITT is not responsible for the loss or damage of personal belongings during tours.

Tour itineraries may change due to traffic and/or other uncontrollable circumstances. The itinerary may also change prior to departure. In the case of itinerary changes, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Trips may be canceled due to unforeseen circumstances. If canceled, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for customers that cannot be contacted by their phone number or email provided at time of booking. Please read the brochure's tour descriptions thoroughly. There will be rest stops on all tours lasting over two hours. It is recommended that you bring enough yen to cover the cost of snacks and meals. Please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to departure time to allow yourself enough time to check in and find a seat. The bus will depart promptly on schedule.

Buses for all ITT tours depart from the parking lot between the Enlisted Club and building 2000. We ask that all passengers return to the same seat taken at the beginning of the tour and return to the bus on time as directed by the tour guide.

Parents must ensure their children are well behaved and do not disturb other passengers. Listening and/or watching videos, music, etc. is permitted with the use of headphones. Please refrain from talking on the phone while seated on the bus.

Yokota ITT will make every reasonable effort to accommodate group seating when requested. However, due to seating and ticket availability, this may not always be possible.

YOKOTA TOUR WAIT-LIST POLICY

A waiting list is available for tours that have reached maximum capacity. If there are any cancellations, ITT staff will contact those on the waiting list at most three times via phone. If there is no answer, ITT will move on to the next person on the list. Customers are responsible for making sure that the contact information provided is correct.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

All tour cancellations due to inclement weather will be determined by 4 p.m. the day before the scheduled tour. Customers will be notified by 6 p.m. the day before.

For multi-day trips where inclement weather causes an overnight delay, customers will be responsible to pay the associated additional cost.

YOKOTA TOURS REFUND POLICY

• **One-Day Tours**
Refunds are provided for cancellations made four or more business days prior to the tour date. Cancellations made after four business days will not be refunded.

• **Overnight Tours**
Please see the tour brochure for the cancellation policy.

In case of a TDY, TAD, exercise or recall, a written document (e.g., TDY orders or letter from squadron commander/first sergeant) must be presented prior to departure for a full refund. In the event that Yokota ITT has already purchased admission tickets, customers will have to pay for the ticket cost regardless of the reason for cancellation. Please have receipt ready at the time of refund. Refunds cannot be given 30 days after the event date.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Smoking and alcoholic beverages are not allowed on ITT Tour buses.

Open containers of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in the seating and aisle area of the bus. All coolers containing alcoholic beverages must be stored within the bus luggage compartment located below and separate from the seating compartment.

Passengers found in the seating area with an alcoholic beverage will be directed to immediately remove the beverage from the bus. Passengers who refuse to comply will be released at the closest train station or an equivalent location.

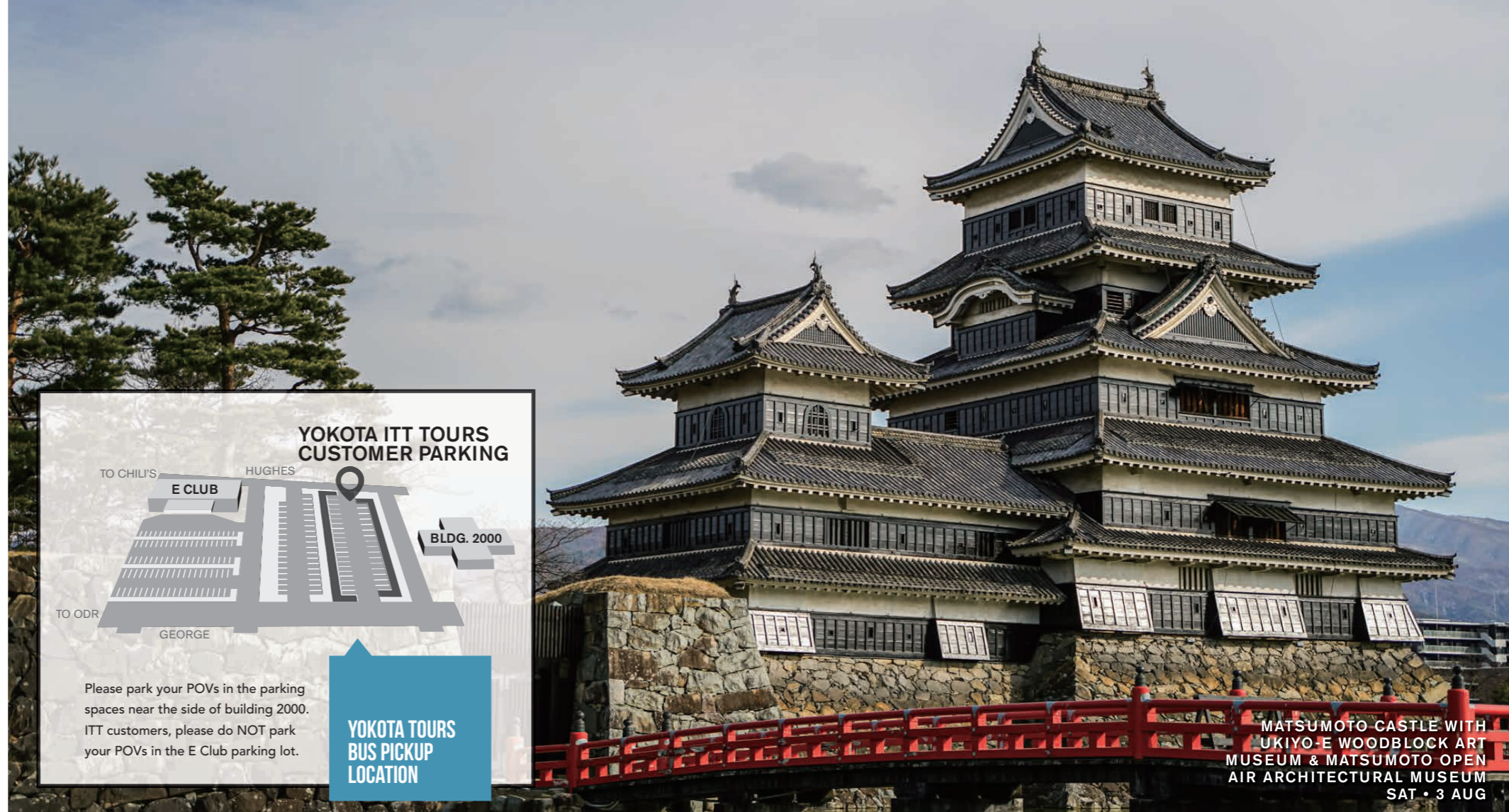

Tour cost includes your bus transportation, castle, and museum admissions. There will be a lot of walking on this tour. There are over 140 flights of stairs in the castle, and you'll need to take your shoes off inside the castle.

Matsumoto Castle is one of the castles designated as national treasures of Japan and is the oldest castle donjon remaining in Japan. Construction began in 1592 on this elegant black and white structure with three turrets. Because of the elegant black roof, Matsumoto Castle is sometimes called the Crow Castle. Inside the castle are steep stairs and low ceilings leading past displays of armor and weapons from the Sengoku period ("Warring States") when the castle was built. The narrow wooden windows, once used by archers and gunmen, provide amazing views of the Japanese Alps, Matsumoto City, and the koi and swans circling in the moat below.

The Ukiyo-e Museum is an ultramodern building housing the private collection of the Sakai family, quite simply one of the best museums of woodblock prints in Japan. With more than 100,000 prints, it's believed to be the largest collection of its kind in the world and includes representative masterpieces of all known Ukiyo-e artists.

The Matsumoto Open Air Architectural Museum is a collective of government buildings from the Edo to the late Showa period. The main building is the former Nagano District Court building, which was built in 1908.

The walk to the park may be difficult for smaller children. *Since the monkeys are wild, they may not always be in the park.*

The summer scene at the Nagano Jigokudani Monkey Park is quite different from that of the winter months. The trees are full of green leaves, which shade the hot sun, and vegetation is covering most of the ground. This ideal situation brings the monkeys closer to the park and gives them places to hide and eat. There are also wild berries, flowers, and insects for them to eat. It's also an important time for most of the babies that were born in the early spring to make their appearance to the other monkeys and to us visitors. During this time, among many other monkey activities, you will be able to see babies playing and their mothers watching over them.

After the monkey park, we will stop by Shinshu Fruits Land for peach picking with all-you-can-eat chilled peaches for 30 minutes. You'll also get to pick two peaches to take home.

Tour cost includes bus transportation and admission to the observatory. There may be a line to get to the observatory to see the rice paddy art. There will be some walking in Kawagoe.

See Gyoda City's rice paddy art, also known as tanbo art, up close in person from the 150 ft observatory deck. Every year, they plant a different mural, and this year it will be an image of the Kiriko Festival of Noto. You can also enjoy a garden with lotus flowers around the park.

Kawagoe's main street is lined with kurazukuri, or warehouse-style buildings, which retain an ambience reminiscent of an old town from the Edo Period (1603-1868) and allow us to imagine what the streets looked like in the past. During the Edo Period, Kawagoe prospered as a supplier of commodities to Edo, now Tokyo. As Kawagoe was an important city to the capital for trade and strategic purposes, it inherited many aspects of Edo culture and architecture. Visit the famous Bell Tower, Kashiya Yokocho (aka Candy Alley), Hikawa Shrine, and much more.

Asakusa was once the center of Tokyo's Shitamachi culture, or "under town," where commoners lived and thrived. It still retains the hustle and bustle atmosphere of past decades. Asakusa's main attraction is Sensoji, a very popular Buddhist temple established in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the Nakamise, a shopping street that has been providing temple visitors with snacks and souvenirs for centuries. Structures in the temple complex include the main hall, a five-story pagoda, and brilliantly colored gates, as well as the famous Kaminarimon, or "thunder gate," which is an extremely beautiful vermilion-lacquered gate that stands at the entrance.

After enjoying Asakusa, let's take a cruise to Odaiba via the Sumida River. Odaiba is a man-made island on Tokyo Bay and a popular destination for shopping, dining, and entertainment.

Tour cost includes bus transportation and visits to Meiji Shrine, Tsukiji Market, and Asakusa. This tour offers various places to explore in Tokyo and is perfect for a one-day getaway.

You'll visit Meiji Shrine, Tsukiji Marketplace, and Asakusa Temple on this tour. Meiji Shrine is Japan's most famous Shinto shrine, dedicated to the Meiji emperor and his wife. Visitors to the shrine can take part in typical Shinto activities, such as buying charms and amulets or writing out a wish on an ema (wooden plaque). After visiting the Meiji Shrine, walk around and experience the taste of Japan at the Tsukiji Market. Nicknamed Tokyo's Kitchen, it is one of the largest marketplaces. The streets are lined with many retail shops, restaurants, food stands, and much more. You may also find souvenirs unique to this area.

In Asakusa, you will see the Thunder Gate "Kaminarimon," which is an extremely beautiful vermilion-lacquered gate that stands at the entrance to the shopping lane called Nakamise Avenue and displays the front of the Main Hall of the Sensoji Temple. Asakusa is more than temples and shrines; you'll find many souvenirs, snack shops, and restaurants throughout the streets.

Enjoy Sunday brunch at the New Sanno Hotel, home to the finest brunch in town. Delicacies abound at this all-you-can-eat buffet. Freshly baked breads, rolls, and croissants complement an array of traditional and international favorites, including Belgian waffles, made-to-order omelets, and several carving stations. You can also indulge in the salad bar, fresh sushi bar, a great seafood station, multiple entrées, petit-fours, cakes, and pastries to top off the exciting assortment of delicious dishes.

Ueno Park is famous for Ueno Zoo, cherry trees, many museums, temples, and shrines. There are many places you can visit in Ueno Park. The Ueno Zoo is the oldest zoo in Japan, which has grown over the years, expanded its area, and been a forerunner in the Japanese zoo world. For those interested in museums, there are the Tokyo National Museum, National Science Museum, Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum, National Museum of Western Art, and more. Bring extra yen for snacks and admissions.

The Yoshida Fire Festival, or "Yoshida no Himatsuri," is held every year on August 26th. It is said that the ceremony appeases the goddess of Mt. Fuji, and to keep the volcano from erupting for another year. Yoshida no Himatsuri also serves as the closing ceremony of the Fujisan summer climbing season.

For this lively festival, named one of Japan's three most unique festivals and celebrated for over 500 years, the entire community comes out to watch the burning of large "taimatsu" torches and the parade of two large portable shrines called "Omikoshi" through the streets. The Fire Festival is one of Fujiyoshida's most prized cultural possessions, and this year's festival promises to live up to its reputation.

Tour cost includes your bus transportation, the ropeway, boat cruise, and checkpoint admissions. If a gas alert is announced, we may leave the valley early for lunch by the lake. The path to the geyser is not yet completely open to the public.

Please note that the volcanic gasses may affect persons with respiratory illness.

Hakone National Park is part of the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park, less than 100 kilometers from Tokyo. Famous for its volcanic landscapes and hot springs, Hakone National Park is one of the most popular destinations among Japanese and international tourists.

See a sweeping view of the National Park from the aerial cable car and at the valley "Owakudani" (Hell Valley), where you will see smoking volcanic activity and be able to sample volcanic-cooked black eggs. Enjoy the natural scenery and a delightful boat ride across Lake Ashi.

Hakone Checkpoint used to be an important checkpoint to control traffic along the Tokaido highway, which linked Tokyo with Kyoto during the feudal Edo Period. This checkpoint controlled weapons from being brought into Edo and also kept women and children from fleeing Edo. It was in operation for more than 260 years, until 1868, when the Edo period changed to the Meiji period.

Hakone Shrine stands at the foot of Mt. Hakone along the shores of Lake Ashi. Founded in 757, this shrine is known for its large red torii gate that stands in the lake.

"Iyashinosato" Japanese Village stands on the site of a former farming village on the western shores of Lake Saiko. The village was reconstructed and reopened as an open-air museum and traditional craft village, where people can learn about the culture, try out, and purchase different local handicrafts. The village is now made up of more than twenty houses that have been converted into shops, restaurants, museums, and galleries. The Fuji Kachoen Garden Park welcomes you with over 30 varieties of feathered friends. The owl enclosure holds more than 100 owls, most of which were hand-bred by the park staff and are quite friendly to people! The park is also home to an extensive selection of over 10,000 begonias, fuchsias, and hydrangeas, which are exhibited throughout the park. You can enjoy these blooming flowers all year round.

One of the Fuji Caves that has been opened to the public is the Wind Cave. Its temperature is about freezing and has ice formations throughout the year that were formed from water seeping through the ceiling of the cave.

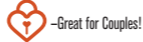
