

YOKOTA ITT TOUR POLICY

Yokota ITT tours are open to all SOFA status members/ DoD Card Holders, including active duty military, U.S. DoD civilians, retired military and their dependents. Sponsored guests of eligible customers may participate on ITT tours. Customers must be 18 or older to sign up for ITT tours. Participants 17 and under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Local National Employees and JASDF members may sign up for tours starting 7 days prior to the tour date on non-SOFA eligible tours.

Eligible customers are permitted to purchase up to ten tickets. For special tours, customers are permitted to purchase up to five tickets.

Please sign up for tours in person at the ITT office. Reservations over the phone or on Yokota FSS Travel Facebook Page are not accepted.

Please notify ITT staff of any special needs you or your family may have (e.g., wheelchair accessibility, physical or health disabilities, etc.)

Payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation. The ITT office accepts U.S. dollars, VISA, MasterCard, American Express and U.S. checks. Japanese yen is not accepted. Certain trips offer payment plans and will be indicated on the tour description.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on tours. Yokota ITT is not responsible for the loss or damage of personal belongings during tours.

Tour itineraries may change due to traffic and/or other uncontrollable circumstances. The itinerary may also change prior to departure. In the case of itinerary changes, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Trips may be canceled due to unforeseen circumstances. If canceled, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Please read the brochure's tour descriptions thoroughly. There will be rest stops on all tours lasting over two hours. It is recommended that you bring enough yen to cover the cost of snacks and meals. Please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to departure time to allow yourself enough time to check in and find a seat. The bus will depart promptly on schedule.

Buses for all ITT tours depart from the parking lot between the Enlisted Club and building 2000. We ask that all passengers return to the same seat taken at the beginning of the tour and return to the bus on time as directed by the tour guide.

Parents must ensure their children are well behaved and do not disturb other passengers. Listening and/or watching videos, music, etc. is permitted with the use of headphones. Please refrain from talking on the phone while seated on the bus.

Yokota ITT will make every reasonable effort to accommodate group seating when requested. However, due to seating and ticket availability, this may not always be possible.

YOKOTA TOUR WAIT-LIST POLICY

A waiting list is available for tours that have reached maximum capacity. If there are any cancellations, ITT staff will contact those on the waiting list at most three times via phone. If there is no answer, ITT will move on to the next person on the list. Customers are responsible for making sure that the contact information provided is correct.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

All tour cancellations due to inclement weather will be determined by 4 p.m. the day before the scheduled tour. Customers will be notified by 6 p.m. the day before.

For multi-day trips where inclement weather causes an overnight delay, customers will be responsible to pay the associated additional cost.

YOKOTA TOURS REFUND POLICY

• **One-Day Tours**
Refunds are provided for cancellations made four or more business days prior to the tour date. Cancellations made after four business days will not be refunded.

• **Overnight Tours**
Please see the tour brochure for the cancellation policy.

In case of a TDY, TAD, exercise or recall, a written document (e.g., TDY orders or letter from squadron commander/first sergeant) must be presented prior to departure for a full refund. In the event that Yokota ITT has already purchased admission tickets, customers will have to pay for the ticket cost regardless of the reason for cancellation. Please have receipt ready at the time of refund. Refunds cannot be given 30 days after the event date.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Smoking and alcoholic beverages are not allowed on ITT Tour buses.

Open containers of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in the seating and aisle area of the bus. All coolers containing alcoholic beverages must be stored within the bus luggage compartment located below and separate from the seating compartment.

Passengers found in the seating area with an alcoholic beverage will be directed to immediately remove the beverage from the bus. Passengers who refuse to comply will be released at the closest train station or an equivalent location.

The tour cost includes bus transportation, visits to the Meiji Shrine, admission to Tokyo Tower's 1st observatory, and entry to Hamarikyu Garden. Please note that there is a significant amount of walking on this tour. Admission to the top observatory of Tokyo Tower is not included.

This tour is the perfect one-day getaway for exploring Tokyo! Begin with a visit to Meiji Shrine, Japan's most famous Shinto shrine. Visitors can participate in traditional Shinto activities, such as purchasing charms and amulets or writing wishes. Next, we'll head to Tokyo Tower, one of the city's iconic landmarks. The main observatory can be accessed by elevator or, for those seeking a challenge, via a 600-step staircase. From the observatory, enjoy stunning views of Tokyo. At the base of the tower, you'll find souvenir shops, cafes, and restaurants. Finally, explore Hamarikyu Garden, a large, beautifully landscaped garden in Tokyo. Originally built as the residence of a feudal lord during the Edo Period, it later served as an imperial garden. The park is home to various plum, cherry trees, and other flowering plants that bloom throughout the year.

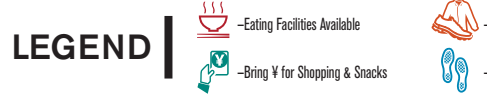

The tour includes bus transportation, a one-way ropeway ride, and temple admission. Please note that this trip involves a significant amount of walking, including ascending and descending many steps. The food at Kanaya Port primarily consists of seafood. If the ropeway is not operational, we will take the bus up. If the ferry boat is canceled, the tour will return via the Aqua Line tunnel.

Built on a 650-mile island surrounded by 360° of water, the "Umihotaru Parking Area" is located approximately midway along the Tokyo Bay Aqua Line Expressway. This bridge/tunnel combination has an overall length of 14 km, consisting of a 4.4 km bridge and a 9.6 km tunnel, making it the fourth-longest underwater tunnel in the world.

Mount Nokogiri, named for its saw-tooth-like mountain range, is home to the Nihon-ji Buddhist temple, which dates back to 725 AD and is located near the summit. The highlight of Mount Nokogiri is the Jigoku Nozoki, or "Peek into Hell," a thrilling viewpoint at the mountain's peak. Be prepared to climb over 400 steps to reach the top, with more than 2,600 steps throughout the entire mountain. After "peeking into hell," we will visit the impressive Buddha statue carved from stone, standing 102 feet (31 meters) tall—equivalent to a ten-story building—located midway up the mountain. On our way back, we will take a 40-minute ferryboat ride across Tokyo Bay.

From late November to early December, the trees transform into vibrant fall colors of bright yellow, orange, and red. Ueno Park offers many attractions to explore. Ueno Zoo, the oldest zoo in Japan, has expanded over the years and remains a leader in the Japanese zoo community. For museum enthusiasts, the park is home to several, including the Tokyo National Museum, the National Museum of Nature and Science, the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum, and the National Museum of Western Art. Be sure to bring extra yen for lunch, snacks, and admission fees. Don't forget your camera to capture the memories of this amazing trip!

It shows the high degree of prosperity that was present during the 12th and 13th centuries when Kamakura was the seat of the Shogunate Government.

You'll need to climb almost 400 steps to reach it and every step can be worth it for the spectacular view. Our next stop will be a buffet style lunch at the Fuji Highland Resort Hotel. Enjoy their tasty buffet including Western, Italian, and Japanese cuisine. This tour will also take you up to the 5th station of this beautiful and bold volcano via the Subaru Line. Bring your camera and enjoy all the beauty of Mt. Fuji.



juicy tangerines for 30 minutes and take home a bag of souvenir tangerines! Enjoy breathtaking views from Japan's longest suspension bridge! The Mishima Skywalk is the longest pedestrian suspension bridge in Japan where you can enjoy unrestricted panoramic views of the western slopes of Mt. Fuji as well as that of the Izu Mountains. The bridge is 1,312 ft long and 232 ft high and 5.2 ft wide with the suspension tower 144 ft high. Take a break and shop for souvenirs at the Sky Garden filled with flowers in season with chandelier-like flower decorations covering the ceiling. Our next stop is Gotemba Premium Outlet. This open-air shopping center is located near Mt. Fuji with great views of the mountain on clear days. Enjoy shopping with over 200 outlets, including high-end global brands, restaurants and casual eateries.

Would you like to meet a samurai? Have you ever seen a ninja in action? As any resident of Japan will tell you, the atmosphere of old Edo has long since evaporated from most of Tokyo, but don't despair, this former capital of the Tokugawa Shoguns continues to thrive in Nikko Edo Wonderland. This is a theme park that reproduces the customs, cultures, and society of Japan's Edo Period (1603-1867). This is not a museum. Nikko Edo Wonderland is an attempt to produce a faithful re-creation of everyday life in old Edo. Visitors are transformed from mere onlookers into active participants in the daily activities of Edo townsfolk.

Umihotaru is a unique highway service area located on a 650-meter artificial island, surrounded by water on all sides. Standing five levels tall, with parking and various leisure facilities, it is situated midway along the Tokyo Bay Aqua-Line Expressway—a 14-kilometer bridge and tunnel combination. The Aqua-Line includes a 4.4-kilometer bridge and a 9.6-kilometer tunnel beneath the bay, making it the fourth-longest underwater tunnel in the world. Mitsui Outlet Park in Kisarazu is a large outlet mall located on the Chiba side of Tokyo Bay. Here, you'll find high-quality products from both domestic and international brands at outlet prices. With over 300 stores, it is Japan's largest outlet mall. In addition to shopping, the mall features numerous rest spots, including a beautiful garden terrace, lounges, and cafés.

Among the animals are polar bears, penguins, Canadian otters, rare white Russian dolphins, and thousands of fish. The aquarium's special feature is a 20-meter-long escalator that carries visitors into a sea-through tunnel to view enormous fish tanks.

Iyashinosato Japanese Village is located on the site of a former farming village along the western shores of Lake Saiko. The village has been reconstructed and reopened as an open-air museum and traditional craft village, where visitors can learn about local culture, try out various crafts, and purchase unique handicrafts. The village now consists of more than twenty houses, which have been transformed into shops, restaurants, museums, and galleries. Fuji Kachoen Garden Park is home to over 30 species of birds, including more than 100 owls, most of which were hand-raised by park staff and are very friendly to visitors. The park also boasts a vast collection of over 10,000 fergonias, fuchsias, and hydrangeas, which bloom year-round, offering a stunning display of flowers in every season.

Asakusa was once the center of Tokyo's Shitamachi culture, or "downtown," where commoners lived and thrived. It still retains the lively, bustling atmosphere of past decades. The main attraction in Asakusa is Sensoji, a popular Buddhist temple established in the 7th century. Visitors reach the temple via Nakamise, a shopping street that has provided snacks and souvenirs to temple-goers for centuries. The temple complex features several notable structures, including the main hall, a five-story pagoda, brightly colored gates, and the famous Kaminarimon, or "Thunder Gate," a striking vermilion-lacquered gate at the entrance. After exploring Asakusa, we'll take a relaxing cruise along the Sumida River to Odaiba, a man-made island on Tokyo Bay known for its shopping, dining, and entertainment options.

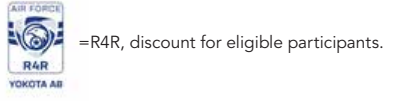

Sunshine City is Tokyo's first "city within a city." It features a variety of shops and restaurants, an aquarium, a planetarium, a museum, and indoor theme parks, as well as the Sunshine Prince Hotel. Sunshine Aquarium occupies the top three floors of Ikebukuro's Sunshine City office and shopping complex. It features approximately 80 tanks housing 37,000 fish representing 750 species. Notable exhibits include the Sunshine Lagoon, which holds 240 tons of water; the Jellyfish Tunnel; and the Sunshine Aqua Ring, where visitors can view sea lions, penguins, and other animals from below. Rare specimens include giant manta rays, large sunfish, and deep-water spider crabs, along with non-marine animals such as anteaters, snails, iguanas, flamingos, and a lemur.
