

**YOKOTA ITT TOUR POLICY**

Yokota ITT tours are open to all SOFA status members/ DoD Card Holders, including active duty military, U.S. DoD civilians, retired military and their dependents. Sponsored guests of eligible customers may participate on ITT tours. Customers must be 18 or older to sign up for ITT tours. Participants 17 and under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Local National Employees and JASDF members may sign up for tours starting 7 days prior to the tour date on non-SOFA eligible tours.

Eligible customers are permitted to purchase up to ten tickets. For special tours, customers may purchase up to five tickets, or the amount specified by ITT.

Please sign up for tours in person at the ITT office. Reservations over the phone, Yokota ITT Facebook or by emails are not accepted. Non-Yokota community members not residing in the local area may register via email beginning one week after the sign-up period opens.

Please notify ITT staff of any special needs you or your family may have (e.g., wheelchair accessibility, physical or health disabilities, etc.)

Payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation. The ITT office accepts U.S. dollars, VISA, MasterCard, American Express and U.S. checks. Japanese yen is not accepted. Certain trips offer payment plans and will be indicated on the tour description.

Yokota ITT is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on tours. Yokota ITT is not responsible for the loss or damage of personal belongings during tours.

Tour itineraries may change due to traffic and/or other uncontrollable circumstances. The itinerary may also change prior to departure. In the case of itinerary changes, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Trips may be canceled due to unforeseen circumstances. If canceled, the ITT office will notify passengers registered for the trip as soon as possible.

Please read the brochure's tour descriptions thoroughly. There will be rest stops on all tours lasting over two hours. It is recommended that you bring enough yen to cover the cost of snacks and meals. Please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to departure time to allow yourself enough time to check in and find a seat. The bus will depart promptly on schedule.

Buses for all ITT tours depart from the parking lot between the Enlisted Club and building 2000. We ask that all passengers return to the same seat taken at the beginning of the tour and return to the bus on time as directed by the tour guide.

Parents must ensure their children are well behaved and do not disturb other passengers. Listening and/or watching videos, music, etc. is permitted with the use of headphones. Please refrain from talking on the phone while seated on the bus.

Yokota ITT will make every reasonable effort to accommodate group seating when requested. However, due to seating and ticket availability, this may not always be possible.

**YOKOTA TOUR WAIT-LIST POLICY**

A waiting list is available for tours that have reached maximum capacity. If there are any cancellations, ITT staff will contact those on the waiting list at most three times via phone. If there is no answer, ITT will move on to the next person on the list. Customers are responsible for making sure that the contact information provided is correct.

**INCLEMENT WEATHER**

All tour cancellations due to inclement weather will be determined by 4 p.m. the day before the scheduled tour. Customers will be notified by 6 p.m. the day before.

For multi-day trips where inclement weather causes an overnight delay, customers will be responsible to pay the associated additional cost.

Refunds are provided for cancellations made four or more business days prior to the tour date. Cancellations made after four business days will not be refunded.

## SUMO RETIREMENT CEREMONY FOR TAKARAFUJI AND EXHIBITION MATCHES

**SUN • 31 MAY**

The tour cost includes round-trip bus transportation and an A-seat ticket (2nd floor). The event will be held at the Ryogoku Kokugikan, Japan’s premier sumo arena. Please note that access to the 2nd-floor seating requires climbing stairs, and there are many stairs throughout the venue. Re-entry is not permitted.

Join us for the retirement ceremony of Takarafuji, featuring a full day of traditional sumo events and cultural performances. The program includes the Juryo ring-entering ceremony and Juryo division matches, followed by humorous sumo performance techniques. Guests will also enjoy traditional chanting-style songs performed by sumo wrestlers, a mage (sumo topknot) styling demonstration, and a sumo taiko drumming demonstration. The event continues with the Makuuchi dohyo-iri (ring-entering ceremony) and concludes with a lineup of Makuuchi division matches. This is a must-see event for sumo fans—one you won’t want to miss!

## MOUNT NOKOGIRI ADVENTURE AND TOKYO BAY CRUISE

The tour includes bus transportation, ferry fare, one-way ropeway, and temple admission.

Please note that this trip involves a significant amount of walking, including many steps, and some paths on Mt. Nokogiri may be slippery. Dining options at Kanaya Port are primarily seafood. In the event the ropeway is suspended, transportation to the mid-mountain area will be provided by bus. If the ferry is canceled, the return journey will be via the Aqua-Line Highway.

Built on a 650-meter artificial island with sweeping 360° ocean views, Umihotaru Parking Area sits midway along the Tokyo Bay Aqua-Line—a 14 km bridge-and-tunnel system, including a 9.6 km tunnel running beneath Tokyo Bay. We then visit Mt. Nokogiri, known for its sawtooth-shaped ridgeline. Near the summit is Nihon-ji Temple, dating back to 725, and the famous Jigoku Nozoki (“Peak into Hell”), a dramatic viewpoint reached by climbing over 400 steps (with more than 2,600 steps across the mountain). Midway down, we’ll stop at the impressive stone-carved Buddha, standing 31 meters (102 ft) tall—about the height of a ten-story building. To finish, enjoy a relaxing 40-minute ferry ride across Tokyo Bay.

## KAMAKURA GREAT BUDDHA & SHRINE

Kamakura is famous for the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan and a number of other iconic temples, shrines,

and old artistic treasures. Kamakura lies at the neck of the Miura Peninsula on the shore of Sagami Bay. It shows the high degree of prosperity that was present during the 12th and 13th centuries when Kamakura was the seat of the Shogunate Government.

## TEA EXPERIENCE AT SAYAMA GREEN TEA SCHOOL

The tour cost includes bus transportation and a hands-on tea experience program. Part of the class will take place in a traditional Japanese tatami room, where seating is on floor cushions. Please note that shoes must be removed before entering the tatami area. Due to the structured nature of the tea program, it is not suitable for smaller children.

Tea is one of the most popular beverages in Japan and an essential part of its culture. Enjoyed throughout the day, a wide variety of teas are produced across the country, with well-known regions including Saitama, Shizuoka, Kagoshima, and Uji—each offering its own unique flavors and characteristics. At Sayama Green Tea School in Saitama, participants can dive into the world of Japanese green tea through an engaging, hands-on program. On this tour, you will experience tea picking, observe the tea-making process, learn about the history of Sayama tea, and take part in tea brewing and tasting. At the end of the program, you’ll even receive a diploma to commemorate your experience.

## CHERRY PICKING & MONKEY PARK IN NAGANO

Tour cost includes bus transportation, admission fee for Monkey Park and Cherry picking. Please be prepared to walk 2 km each way on paved and unpaved path to the park. The walk to the park may be difficult for smaller children. The ground around the cherry trees may get muddy.

\*Since the monkeys are wild, they may not always be in the park.

The summer scene at the Nagano Jigokudani monkey park is quite different than that of the winter months. The trees are full of green leaves, which shade the hot sun, and vegetation is covering most of the ground. This ideal situation brings the monkeys closer to the park and gives them places to hide and rest. There are also wild berries, flowers and insects for them to eat. It’s also an important time for most of the babies that were born in the early spring to make their appearance to the other monkeys and to us visitors. During this time, you will be able to see mothers with their babies, who are clenched tight to their mother’s bodies, sunbathing, eating grass and grains out in the open. It’s also interesting to see how the mother watches over their baby when it wanders off of their bodies. After the monkey park, we will stop by Shinshu Fruits Land for some cherry picking with all-you-can-eat cherries for 30 minutes.

## MATSUMOTO CASTLE AND WASABI FARM

Tour cost includes round-trip bus transportation, wasabi farm visit and admission to castle.

Please note that there are approximately 140 steep steps inside the castle, and the staircases can be quite narrow and steep. Shoes must be removed before entering the castle, so we recommend wearing socks and comfortable footwear that’s easy to take off.

This tour also involves a significant amount of walking, so please plan accordingly.

Daio Wasabi Farm, located in Azumino, Nagano Prefecture, is Japan’s largest wasabi farm. Established in 1915 and covering 15 hectares, the farm cultivates premium wasabi using pristine spring water flowing from the Northern Alps, producing more than 150 tons each year. Visitors can wander along scenic walking paths, admire the iconic traditional watermills, and take in the peaceful countryside atmosphere. Don’t miss the chance to sample the farm’s unique wasabi-infused specialties, including wasabi soba noodles, wasabi ice cream, and wasabi pickles, all available at the on-site restaurants and shops.

Matsumoto Castle is one of only four castles designated as National Treasures of Japan and remains largely in its original form. Construction began in 1592, and its elegant black-and-white structure with three turrets has earned it the nickname “Crow Castle” due to its striking black exterior. Inside, steep staircases and low ceilings lead visitors past impressive displays of armor and weapons from the Sengoku, or Warring States, period when the castle was built.

The tour cost includes round-trip bus transportation, lunch buffet and cave admission. You may wish to bring a sweater or jacket, as temperatures at the 5th Station of Mt. Fuji can be quite chilly.

\*If access to the 5th Station is not possible due to closure for any reason, the tour will visit Oshino Village instead.

Marvel at the breathtaking beauty of Shiraito Waterfall. Its name, meaning “white threads,” perfectly captures the delicate streams cascading down the rock face, and it is recognized as one of Japan’s 100 greatest waterfalls. We’ll also stop by the Fugaku Wind Cave, a natural lava cave known for its refreshing cool air - perfect for a quick escape from the heat and a fascinating look into the area’s volcanic geology. You’ll also enjoy a buffet-style lunch at the Fuji Highland Resort Hotel, featuring a delicious selection of Western, Italian, and Japanese dishes. The journey continues up the Subaru Line to the 5th Station of Mt. Fuji, where spectacular views of this iconic and majestic volcano await—so be sure to bring your camera to capture the scenery.

Yokohama Zoorasia is one of Japan’s newer and most expansive zoos, built around the themes of “Symbiosis of Life” and “Harmony with Nature.” Animals are housed in large, thoughtfully designed enclosures that closely replicate their natural habitats, creating a more immersive and humane experience.

The zoo is divided into eight distinct ecological zones: the Asian Tropical Forest, Subarctic Forest, Oceanian Grassland, Central Asian Highland, Japanese Countryside, Amazon Jungle, African Tropical Rainforest, and African Savannah—each offering a unique glimpse into wildlife from around the world. Highlights include elephants, polar bears, black bears, okapi, and proboscis monkeys. In addition to the animal exhibits, the park features restaurants and cafés, scenic nature trails, and recreation areas that make it especially enjoyable for families with children.

## SHOSENKYO GORGE AND SAMURAI TEMPLE

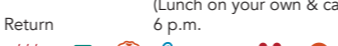

The tour cost includes bus transportation, temple admission, and the cable car ride. There will be a pleasant 1.2 km walk along the gorge to the ropeway station. You may choose to enjoy the walk or remain on the bus and proceed directly to the ropeway station.

This historical tour takes you to the burial site of Takeda Shingen, a renowned samurai warlord who died in 1572 while on his campaign toward Kyoto. The temple is also known for its exquisite garden designed by Muso Kokushi, a prominent Zen priest of the samurai era.

The journey continues into Chichibu-Tama-Kai National Park, where you will ride a cable car up Mount Kimpu for stunning views of Shosenkyo Gorge, formed along the Arakawa River. Don’t forget your camera—this area is famous for its dramatic cliffs and uniquely shaped rock formations. Please note that food options at Shosenkyo are primarily Japanese cuisine. If you prefer alternatives, we recommend picking up something at a service area stop beforehand.

## HAKKEIJIMA SEA PARADISE AQUARIUM & AMUSEMENT PARK

This premier seaside destination combines thrilling amusement rides with one of Japan’s most impressive aquarium experiences. At the heart of the park is a striking pyramid-shaped aquarium spanning five levels, each showcasing a diverse range of marine life. One of the highlights is the unique 20-meter-long escalator that transports visitors into a transparent underwater tunnel—offering an immersive, up-close view of massive tanks filled with majestic sea creatures swimming all around you. Whether you’re seeking adventure or a relaxing day by the sea, Hakkeijima Sea Paradise offers something for everyone!

Celebrate Father’s day at the New Sanno Hotel. Delicacies abound at this all-you-can-eat buffet. Fresh baked breads, omelets made-to-order and carved beef are the highlights. Include a salad bar, fresh sushi, seafood station, multiple entrees, cooking and carving stations, cakes and pastries to top off the exciting assortment of delicious dishes. Odaiba is one of Tokyo’s most popular tourist attractions with an impressive shopping complex consisting of malls, theme parks and museums. DECKS Tokyo Beach next to Odaiba Beach features many entertainment centers including Tokyo Joypolis, with the latest on electronic games, LEGOLAND Discovery Center, Madame Tassauds’ Wax Museum and more. Aqua City next to DECKS Tokyo beach is an entertainment mall featuring many restaurants, shops and

amusement facilities. DiverCity is a shopping mall with many stores with a wide selection of Japan-themed souvenirs shops, cafes and restaurants.

Fukiware Falls, located in northern Gunma Prefecture, is recognized as one of Japan’s Top 100 Waterfalls. Spanning nearly 100 feet in width, its distinctive U-shaped formation allows water to cascade from three different directions. Enjoy a leisurely stroll along the riverside and take in the breathtaking scenery of this remarkable natural wonder. Enjoy a lunch stop at Kawaba Denen Plaza, a popular roadside station known for its fresh local produce, artisanal foods, and charming rural atmosphere. It’s the perfect place to relax, explore, and sample regional specialties. Takasaki Byakue Kannon, also known as the White-Robed Kannon, is a towering statue of the goddess of mercy located on the grounds of Jigan-in Temple in Takasaki. Standing at 137 feet tall, the statue features nine interior levels connected by 146 steps, with each level lined with Buddhist deity statues. After a short climb to the upper level—reaching shoulder height—you’ll be rewarded with sweeping views of the surrounding mountains.

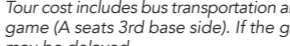

## MEIJI SHRINE, TOKYO TOWER AND HAMARIKYU JAPANESE GARDEN

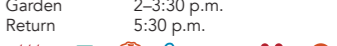

Tour cost includes bus transportation and admission to the Main Observatory at Tokyo Tower. Top Observatory access is not included in this tour.

This tour offers a variety of highlights across Tokyo, making it perfect for a one-day getaway. You’ll begin with a visit to Meiji Shrine, one of Japan’s most famous Shinto shrines, dedicated to Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken. Visitors can experience traditional Shinto practices, such as purchasing charms and amulets or writing wishes on an ema (wooden plaque). Next, take in sweeping views of the city from the Main Observatory of Tokyo Tower, accessible by elevator or for the more adventurous, a 600-step staircase. At the base of the tower is FootTown, featuring a variety of souvenir shops, cafes, restaurants, and an indoor amusement area with games and attractions. The tour concludes at the beautiful Hamarikyū Gardens, a former feudal lord’s garden dating back to the Edo period. 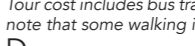
